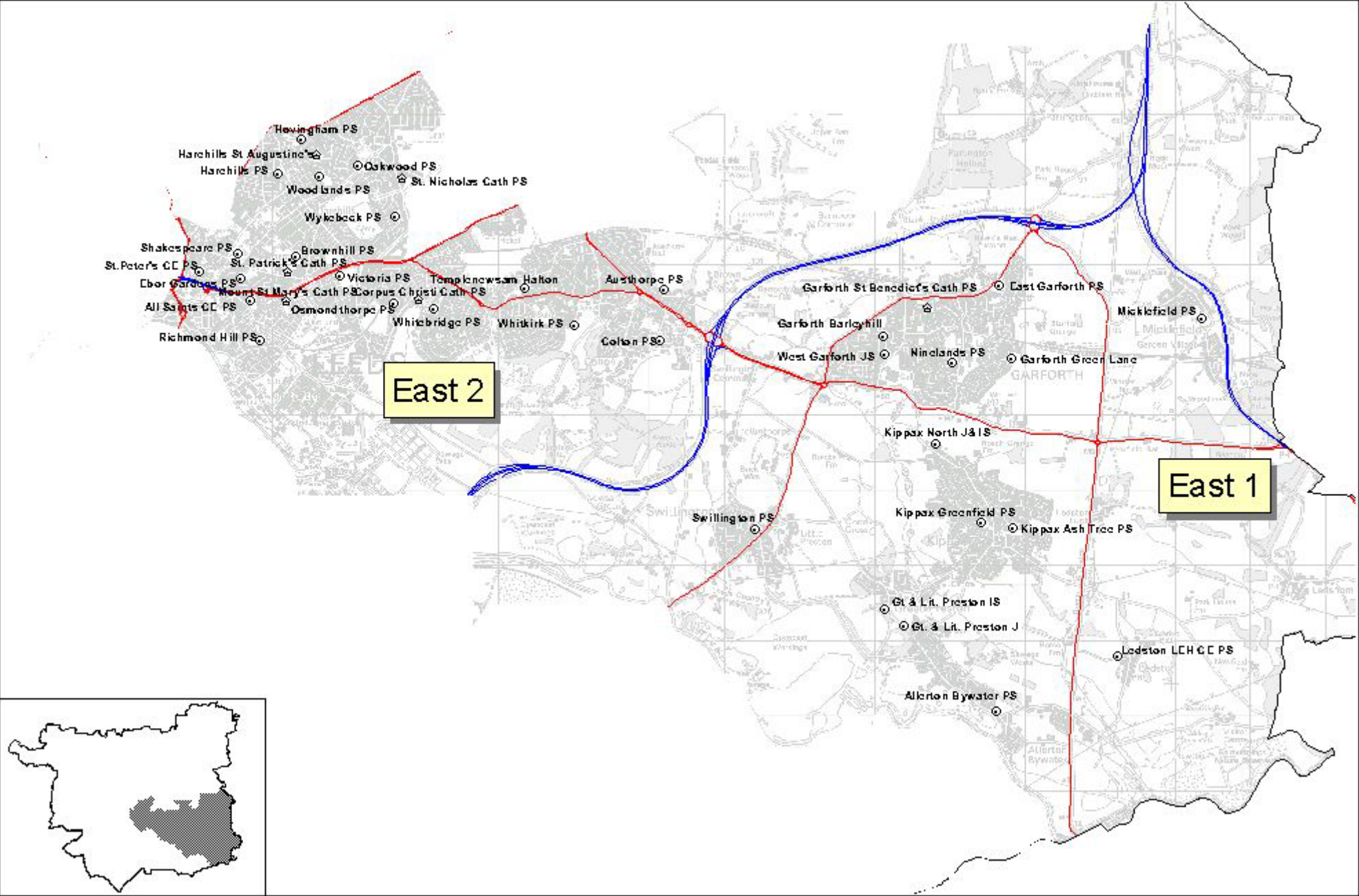

### Current Proposals

**Allerton Bywater Planning Area:** Public consultation has been undertaken on proposals to close Great and Little Preston CE Infant and Great and Little Preston Junior Schools and establish a new one form of entry primary school. These proposals are subject to further discussions on the status of the proposed new school.

**Garforth Planning Area:** The Executive Board of the City Council has approved proposals to close Garforth Barleyhill Infant and West Garforth Junior Schools and establish a new one and a half form of entry primary school on the Junior school site in September 2004.

**Kippax Planning Area:** Kippax Ash Tree Primary School has been identified for a consolidation scheme onto one site in the 10 schools PFI scheme.

### New Housing Developments

The Millennium Village development in Allerton Bywater will have a significant impact on the pupil population in the area. 520 new houses have approval in principle. Prospective developers are aware of the need for enhanced primary school provision and must incorporate this into their proposals for the site. There is a further proposed development for 110 dwellings at Queen Street, Woodend, but this is unlikely to proceed for at least 10 years. A greenfield site South of Micklefield for 150 dwellings and a further site at Manor Farm, Micklefield for 300 dwellings, are not likely to be developed within the next five years. A site at Selby Road, Garforth for 85 dwellings, is unlikely to be released for development for at least 10 years.

#### Current Proposals

**Burmantofts Planning Area:** Shakespeare Primary School has been identified for rebuilding as part of the Secondary PFI scheme, scheduled for completion September 2006.

**Osmondthorpe Planning Area:** In September 2003 the School Organisation Committee approved proposals to close Osmondthorpe Primary and Whitebridge Primary schools and establish a new two form of entry primary school, from September 2004, on a new site.

**Richmond Hill Planning Area:** The Catholic Diocese are considering a rebuild of Mount St Mary's Catholic Primary School.

#### New Housing Developments

A site has been identified at Seacroft Hospital for 520 dwellings, however this is unlikely to proceed for at least 10 years. Oak Tree Drive, LS8 has been identified as a potential site for 100 dwellings, and Waterloo Sidings for 140 dwellings, although no planning permission has yet been granted at either. There are a large number of smaller developments planned across Richmond Hill although many of these are student flats and apartments. There is a large development planned for Hunslet Riverside of 1000 dwellings but again these are mainly apartments.
